Aquatic Recreation (AQUA) saw increased participation over last year in semi-private and private swim lessons, swim team, and American Red Cross classes (e.g., Adult & Pediatric CPR/First Aid, Lifeguard Recertification, etc.).

The Arts have taken off at **Borchard Community Center (BOC)**, where participation in dance classes has more than doubled to over 100 enrollments. Other programs such as crocheting and painting have also grown.

Conejo Community Center (CCC) offered "No School Day" programs for CVUSD students on both Martin Luther King, Jr. Day and Presidents Day, but neither day saw any participation. Similar programs held last year brought in over 100 enrollments in total.

Hillcrest Center for the Arts (HCFA) had 207 fewer CVUSD students participate in Elementary Music this year.

Thousand Oaks Community Center (TOC) now oversees programs held at McCrea Ranch, which were previously under **Outdoor Recreation**. This transition accounts for most of the decrease for Outdoor and the increase for TOC.

Therapeutic Recreation (TR) saw significant increases in participation in its Community Outings as well as Fitness programs held at Old Meadows Center.
